Dear Neighbors:

About Our Speaker

Judi Wright's career and civic leadership has demonstrated a commitment to civil rights, civic responsibility, neighborhood advocacy, and public service. A member of the BPD Neighborhood Crime Watch Unit since 1991, Judi has been its Executive Director since 2002. Prior to her work for the Boston Police, Judi served as the Executive Assistant to the Commissioners of the Massachusetts Commission Against Discrimination (MCAD). In addition to her extensive volunteering, Judi is a certified Massachusetts Crime Prevention Officer and a Certified Mediator.

About the Crime Watch Meeting

Among the topics Judi will discuss, with input from the community, are how to:

- Organize a Crime Watch network
- Call the police to convey critical information
- Communicate crime reports efficiently throughout the community
- Empower our community to fight crime through prudent tactics not fear
- Make our properties safe from break-ins

Why a Community-Wide Crime Watch?

The JHA commends a small group of our neighbors who created a crime watch in one part of Moss Hill. By working with all our neighbors to create crime watches throughout Moss Hill, we can improve

communication, collaborate better with police, and create a safer neighborhood. **Crime Watches are effective only when the *entire* community gets involved and connected.**

How a Crime Watch Works

To communicate police reports and safety alerts effectively, we need a network of street captains throughout Moss Hill. After reporting a crime or suspected criminal activity to police, a resident contacts the street captain for his or her area. The street captain then informs other street captains. All street captains email (or phone as necessary) the residents in their respective areas.

So that residents can easily contact *all* street captains at one time, the JHA has created an email address: crimewatch@jamaicahills.org. Residents who do not use email should call their street captain.

Note that Judi's presentation September 12 offers more specific Crime Watch guidelines and incorporates suggestions and ideas from the community.

What Responsibilities Do Street Captains Have?

Street captains are a point of contact for residents who have filed police reports. They promptly distribute these reports to residents in their area, as well as other street captains, via email or phone. Captains maintain an updated list of residents' names, addresses, email addresses, and phone numbers.

How Do I Become a Street Captain?

Concerned and proactive neighbors have already volunteered to become street captains for some parts of Moss Hill. The chart in this mailing shows what areas or streets are covered and which ones still need captains. We urge you to volunteer to become a street captain or co-captain. Consider the added benefit of getting to know your neighbors better and making new friends.
